Baby Sanju just like any other child is very energetic and is usually attracted by newer objects. She is not only adorable to her parents but too the neighbor as well and usually likes to play with the other kids from around the household. One day while playing with a stick she got hurt in her left eye followed by pain and watering. Her parents at first thought that the problem the child is facing will be relieved by itself.

But after 2 days, the situation became worse and the poor little child was not able to open her eyes. Her parents now were worried about her condition. She was continuously complaining about the pain. Her father, Mr. Virendra, is an agricultural laborer and work in the field of others. It was a big challenge for a family head earning Rs. 150/- per day to avail private eye care service for his child. The worried father was just sitting with his neighbor and during casual discussion he talked about Sanju's problem with them who at once suggested Mr. Virendra to visit Sadguru Sankalp Netra Chikitsalaya (SSNC), Anandpur.

He brought his daughter to SSNC on 14 June 2014 and where she was examined in Pediatric Ophthalmology Department. The child with the complaint of sudden loss of vision, ocular pain and watering of left eye was diagnosed with Traumatic Cataract. Her father was counseled about the disease

and the possible intervention to resolve the problem little Sanju was witnessing. Assessing the poor economic condition, the counselor informed Mr. Virendra about the MacDonald's initiative. Her father at once gave his consent for the surgery of Sanju at SSNC.

After review examinations on 18 June and 4 July she was finally operated for Left Eye traumatic Cataract under general anesthesia on 19 July 2014. The child showed good post-op recovery and with a follow up note she was finally discharged on 21 July 2014. Sanju was now relieved from severe pain and watery eye. Her father was very pleased and thanked everybody as his daughter can now walk, play and do all the activities just like before.
